Selected Aspects of Agricultural Production in the Country, by Vladimír Mackovič

The methodology of OECD, as applied by Eurostat, defines country area as a zone of a population density under 100 per sq. km. Based on such criterion, 80 % municipalities in the Czech Republic are of rural character, occupying some 75 % of the territory of the state. Yet mere 22.3 % of the Czech population live in such areas. Agriculture always was, and naturally keeps on being, strongly linked to country settlements and the land. For such areas, the economic, social, and landscaping potential of agricultural production is of immense importance. The smaller are the settlements and the lower is the population density, the higher is the importance of agriculture. Our contribution endeavours to characterize, analyse, and generalize the spatial, urban planning, and landscaping criteria of agricultural premises.
